**waterSmartSM to Recognize Cobb-County Students at
First Annual H2O in HD Awards Ceremony**

WHAT: Twenty-one videos produced and created by Cobb County High School Students will be recognized during waterSmart's "H2O in HD" awards ceremony Tuesday, May 14, at Southern Polytechnic State University.

H2O in HD – a creative competition merging students' artistic talents with their passion for water conservation – invited Cobb County high school students to create 30-60 second Public Service Announcements showcasing water conservation and video production skills. Entries were scored by the Cobb County-Marietta Water Authority, Cobb County Water System, a select panel of judges and online voters.

In its first year, the contest received 21 entries from eight Cobb-County high schools, including:
